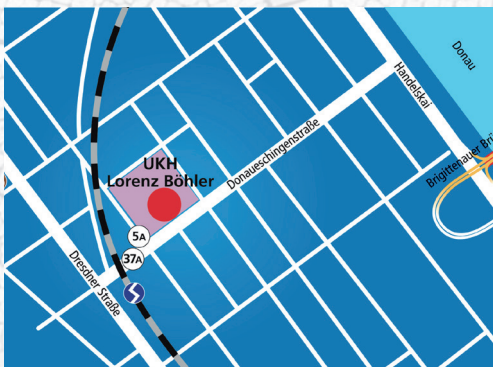

Program Description

An interactive, Seminar and hands-on Workshop, addressing trauma and reconstruction of the hand and wrist with representative cases and discussions. 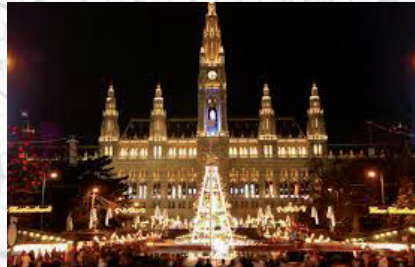
